 Do NOT use check marks or X to mark ballot.
 Do NOT sign, cut, tear or damage the ballot.

If you make a mistake or change your mind on a selection:
 A. Do not attempt to mark through the selection or attempt to erase. Write "Spoken" across the ballot AND across the return envelope.
 B. Mail or return the sealed ballot and envelope to your county board of registrars or a non-affiliated absentee ballot box marked for you.
 If you decide to vote in-person: Surrender the ballot to the poll manager at an early voting site within your county or the precinct to which you are assigned. You will then be permitted to vote a regular ballot.

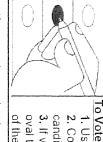
